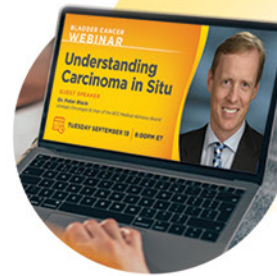
OUR SUPPORT SERVICES

Welcoming and non-judgmental platforms in which patients and caregivers can share their worries, challenges and questions with others who have been diagnosed with bladder cancer.



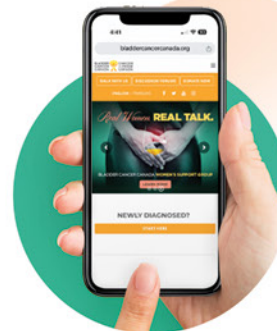
BCC HELPDESK
